ACCE is recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) as the accrediting agency for both 4-year baccalaureate degree programs and two-year associate degree programs in construction, construction science, construction management, and construction technology.

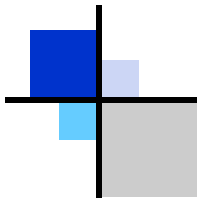
Organized in 1974 by the American Institute of Constructors, the constructor's professional organization, and the Associated Schools of Construction, ACCE enjoys the support of the principal build-

ing and contracting national associations and academic institutions seeking to satisfy the needs for well educated and trained entrants into the construction profession.

By working together under the aegis of ACCE, persons representative of the total construction community and the public at large, construction educators and constructors, establish and maintain standards and criteria for accreditation, provide guidance to those seeking to achieve accredited status, and carry out the accreditation and reaccreditation processes. In doing so, ACCE serves the interests of potential students by helping them identify institutions and programs that offer quality education in the field, and serves the interests of the industry by enabling employers to identify persons who, by reason of their education and training, have the potential for making lasting contributions to the industry and their profession. ACCE also serves the interests of owners/users of constructed facilities and the public at large by raising the professional caliber of constructors and thus the quality of

the construction for which they assume responsibility.

ACCE and the Chartered Institute of Building in the United Kingdom have a reciprocity agreement whereby ACCE recognizes university degree programs accredited by the Chartered Institute of Building as equivalent to baccalaureate programs accredited by ACCE. In turn, CIOB recognizes baccalaureate programs accredited by ACCE as equivalent to university degree programs accredited by CIOB. This agreement was the culmination of a period of evaluation by both parties embracing academic standards comparability, exchange of procedural information and reciprocal observation of accreditation visits.

The Council has had an active year. We accredited one new program, South Dakota State University and welcome them into our group. We reaccredited 13 programs, reviewed progress reports from 25 programs, and accepted 3 programs as new candidates. The total number of programs within ACCE number 58 programs which award Bachelor Degrees, with 7 candidates. The programs which award Associate Degrees number 9 accredited with 5 candidates.

During this year, the Non-Degree Recognition Task Force evaluated 2 programs as part of our pilot program in this area of construction education. The Board of Trustees recognized these 2 programs and will continue to evaluate this element of quality construction education for the future. Another new initiative is our task force on master degree accreditation. Led by Roger Liska, this task force met in Kansas City to further develop guidelines for a pilot project. This effort will test the feasibility of such a program.

Fund-raising within ACCE this year was the most successful in years. With the leadership of Jimmy Gill, ACCE had for the first time a raffle to raise funds for the Dupree Foundation. The raffle was for airfare, 3 nites in a 4-star hotel, \$750 cash and a limo in New Orleans – and then Katrina hit! The “winner” for ACCE was Northern Arizona University’s Construction Management Program. Tom Rogers then re-raffled the tickets to his stake holders and leveraged his initial winnings to the benefit of his program. AND, the winner in Arizona is excited about supporting the rebuilding of New Orleans! So, winners all-around!!

The ACCE/HCA tournament was again a success, contributing over \$38,000 to construction/engineering/architectural programs around the country, and over \$8,000 to ACCE. In November, Joey Hatch and his team at Skanska sponsored a tournament in San Antonio and raised over \$8,000 which will help ACCE and several programs in the San Antonio area, including the initial start of an ACE Mentoring program in San Antonio in 2006. A GREAT year for fund raising for ACCE and for construction education programs!

ACCE is recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation. This is our year to submit our 5-year progress report, and staff has been working on that report, which is due in January, 2006. This is our first progress report for CHEA, and CHEA’s first as well, since ACCE was one of the initial programs recognized by CHEA – a learning experience for all.

ACCE also established a task force for self-assessment, doing for our Council what we expect our programs to do for themselves, outcome assessment. The work of this task force will continue to strengthen our Council, to charting the path for future improvements.

At our Annual meeting in Providence, the Chief Executive of CIOB was in attendance. Chris Blythe acknowledged the 12 year association with ACCE, and supported our continued alliance. We completed negotiations with the National Board for Construction Management Accreditation from the Peoples Republic of China this year. Scheduling challenges



with the Chinese delegation precluded our formal signing of this reciprocal agreement, and we look forward to the execution of this agreement in the coming year. We continue to work with the Canadian Technical Accrediting Board in developing a reciprocal agreement between our two Councils.

Having been elected to serve as the Council’s president for two-years in July 2005, it is with great honor and pride that I submit this Annual Report to you for your review and consideration. All of us associated with ACCE have a reverence for Construction Education and passing along to the next generation what insights and wisdom we hopefully have collected along each of our journeys through this exciting industry building places for our society to live and prosper.
